

### Adapting Fr. Paul’s Message in the Digital Age

**Servant of God, Fr. Paul Wattson, SA** was a Christian media pioneer in many ways. In 1903, as an Episcopal clergyman, he started *The Lamp*, “a Catholic Monthly Devoted to Church Unity and Missions.” The Latin phrase Ut Omnes Unum Sint (“that all be one”) was featured on every page of the publication.

*The Lamp* announced that the first Church Unity Octave to pray for a reunification of Christianity would take place Jan. 18-25, 1908. The dates chosen represented the timespan between the Feast of St. Peter’s Chair in Rome

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and the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul. Along with **Mother Lurana White, SA**, co-founder of the Society of the Atonement, Fr. Paul envisioned Catholics and non-Catholics joining together as God intended.

As the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (as it was eventually named) began to spread, Fr. Paul used other media to promote the event. For example, the Ave Maria Hour, which first aired in 1935, also touted the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.

Through the years, the Graymoor Ecumenical & Interreligious Institute has kept the original message of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity alive as it has adapted to new methods of communication. When COVID-19 severely impacted how we communicated with one another, we took a cue from Fr. Paul's multimedia savvy and initiated the first all-digital Week of Prayer in 2021. All of the tools needed to partake in the theme, "Abide in My Love...You Shall Bear Much Fruit," were available online: daily Scripture and prayer guides, homily notes, etc. Friars communicated with the prayerful via Zoom and other remote methods. Although this year's Week of Prayer for Christian Unity may have been unusual, the impact of the event remained just as powerful as in years past.

We look forward to the world getting back to "normal" as more vaccines are distributed and we are able to more freely go about our daily lives. But, as with every challenge we face, we know that there have been ways to grow in God's love and grace. In 2021, we were reminded of the entrepreneurial spirit of Fr. Paul, as he used the most advanced media of the time to share his message of praying for Christian unity.
